Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

Last Sunday marked the one-year anniversary of our move to online worship. I don't think many of us thought that, a year later, we'd still be worshiping online. I know we are all hopeful that it won't be much longer before we can again meet in our sanctuary. Our Re-entry Task Force is at work to establish guidelines for that time, but we're not quite there yet. Especially with some of us having been vaccinated, I know we are "getting antsy" (as my mom used to say) to meet again in person. I want to take this opportunity to remind you that there are still restrictions, issued by the state, about in-person worship, and they still include a distancing requirement of six feet. Regardless of the percentages issued in state restrictions, the distancing requirement means that we cannot physically accommodate Sunday morning worship.

Know, though, that we are not sitting idle. Our tech crew (D.R. Palmer, Carol Linder, Jeff Salman, and Denice Spicer), along with members of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, are working to prepare our space for hybrid worship so that, even after we can worship in person again, those who feel uncomfortable being together or who are unable to because of health or distance, can still worship with us online.

Many folks have also commented on the things they really like about Zoom worship, including the videos that accompany our music, the ability to see one another's faces rather than the backs of heads, and the closeness they feel "face to face" with me or worship leaders on Zoom's "speaker view," not to mention that we don't have to go out in the cold or rain to get to church, and that we can wear our PJ pants and bunny slippers and no one is the wiser!

As for this week's Zoom, we will share communion together, so please have a bite of something to eat and a sip of something to drink with you when you Zoom in. As always, whether you choose bread and juice, a slice of apple and coffee, or something else, Christ will be present in those elements.

This Sunday is the Fifth Sunday in Lent as we continue "Looking Beyond the Blinders." We'll be looking at what the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus tell us about blinders—a message, I think, that may be particularly applicable to our contemporary culture.

Sunday, March 28, is Palm Sunday. Please plan to drive by the church (from either direction) **between 3:00** and **4:00** p.m. on Saturday, March 27, to receive a blessing and palms for your household. We'll be waving those palms in front of our computer cameras during Palm Sunday worship!
