Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

First, Happy Father's Day to the men reading this note who have nurtured and mentored others. If you are planning to venture out to celebrate the day, please remember to practice physical distancing! With surges in COVID-19 cases in more than 20 states, the need for vigilance continues.

This Sunday we continue "Fishing With Jesus" as we explore the significance of the post-resurrection Jesus' visit to his disciples. You'll find the story in Luke 24:36-48. There's no fishing in this story, but while Jesus is with the disciples, he eats broiled fish as they talk together.

We'll also celebrate communion this week, so please bring to your worship space a bite of something to eat and a sip of something to drink. Remember that, just as Jesus used elements common to his time (bread and wine), we trust that the elements common in our cupboards will signify for us the presence of Christ with us at the virtual table. So grab a cracker, a cookie, a piece of toast or a slice of fruit and a bit of juice, wine, coffee or milk and have it nearby as we come together in worship.

FUPC members, please plan to stay after the postlude for a brief congregational meeting. Once we are able to be together again, we will take care of some non-emergent business, but evolving protocol does encourage us to meet online for emergent business, which includes election of officers for the term starting August 1.

Finally, I encourage you again to commit to learning about racism and other issues that are at the forefront of the news. In July, our book discussion will focus on Robin DiAngelo's book *White Fragility*. Look for more information in the July newsletter.

Look also for an update from the FUPC Re-Entry Task Force, as four members of the group will be attending (virtually, of course) the Faithful Innovation Summit. The Summit's focus will be on the distributed church—that is, the church that is not meeting face-to-face in the sanctuary. According to the Summit's website, we will be exploring these questions: What does it mean to be church—beyond buildings and Sunday services? How can we equip people to be disciples, both through in-person and online interactions? How is God calling us to pivot in light of our current circumstances, in ways that will inform our faithful future?

SCRIPTURE READING: Luke 24:36-48

They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, 'Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.' And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.
