Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

I take this opportunity to update you on a few things.

First, I'm thankful to our Session for their decision that FUPC would be a co-sponsor of the Juneteenth event in Plaza Park on June 19. The church family was well-represented at the event. (I counted at least 20 FUPC family members there.) The organizers' count for all attendees was a little over 200. Among the attendees were Rev. Susan Quass, former Director of the NM Conference of Churches, and Rev. Roger Scott Powers, pastor of St. Andrew Presbyterian Church in Albuquerque. Following Juneteenth, I received a letter from Rev. Quass commending our participation in the event. As we near the celebration of our national "birthday" on July 4, I can think of no better way to honor the intention of our founders than to continue to stand up for freedom, justice, and true equality for all.

Next...when I first started writing these notes to be included in email or snail mail versions of the Sunday Order of Worship, I focused heavily on the pandemic and encouraged everyone to take heart and to take all the steps necessary to protect yourselves and others. We are now seeing restrictions loosened and more flexibility in our activities. Please keep in mind that looser restrictions do not mean we can simply go back to what we used to think of as "normal." We must remain vigilant. Although New Mexico is doing a great job with a COVID curve that is trending downward, we are surrounded by states who are seeing an upswing in COVID cases as people have done just that. So, please, as you enjoy being able to visit your favorite restaurant or have small gatherings on your patio, remember to maintain social distancing, wear a mask if you are not eating or drinking, and continue to wash your hands frequently. And remember, the governor is still asking that, if you travel outside the state, you self-isolate when you return to protect your community. The current guidelines require a 14-day self-isolation for those flying into New Mexico and suggest it for those traveling home from other states by car. I know this can seem burdensome. Our son-in-law's COVID diagnosis (in Wisconsin) means that he, our daughter, and our four grandchildren will be quarantined for the next few weeks. It is not easy to ask a family of six to quarantine, but it protects their friends and co-workers, the patients/clients with whom they interact (our son-in-law is a nurse; our daughter a social worker), and the children with whom our grandchildren share daycare space, as well as casual connections made while running errands. But the virus is real and, for some, deadly. So, to borrow a phrase from an old TV show, "Be careful out there."

Know, too, that your Re-Entry Task Force will be in touch next month to ask your feedback as we make decisions about how we move forward come September and beyond. We know a few things for sure. At this point, gathering for worship is still a high-risk activity. A group of MDs recently released a ranking of various activities from 1 (low risk) to 9 (high risk). "Church" ranked 8. We also know that singing is a "super spreading" activity, as well as a favorite part of our worship together. We will continue to monitor research and our governor's guidelines in order to make the best decisions we can moving forward.

Finally, I will not be with you the next couple of Sundays. As mentioned in earlier communications, I will be on Study Leave from June 24 - 28. Then, D.R. and I will take the week of June 29 for some down time. (I have visions of yard work and baking and reading.). Thank you to Carol Linder, who will be the Zoom host for worship on June 28 and July 5 and will see to the technology demands on those days. Thank you, too, for those who will lead worship on those days: Rod Billingsley, Pat Halverson, Richard Lindeborg, and Peter Linder.

#### SCRIPTURE READING: Romans 6:12-23

Therefore, do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. <sup>13</sup> No longer present your members to sin as instruments<sup>[a]</sup> of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments<sup>[b]</sup> of righteousness. <sup>14</sup> For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

<sup>15</sup> What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! <sup>16</sup> Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? <sup>17</sup> But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, <sup>18</sup> and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. <sup>19</sup> I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations.<sup>[c]</sup> For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

<sup>20</sup>When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. <sup>21</sup>So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. <sup>22</sup> But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. <sup>23</sup> For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
