Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

This Sunday we will spend some more time with Job. We will hear him declare that he is so miserable he wants to die. We will hear a friend rebuke him for not being repentant. And we will hear him cry out to God, whom he thinks has targeted him with suffering. With Job's story as our conversation partner, we will explore feelings of suffering, despair, and abandonment.



Poet and painter William Blake (1757-1827) painted a series of images from the book of Job. This one, called "Job Rebuked by His Friends," was painted in 1825-26, not long before Blake's death. It depicts Job with his wife at his right hand while three of his friends rebuke him. This week we'll hear from one of these friends, Eliphaz, who implies in his speech to Job that Job's 10 children died because they did not live upright lives. Indeed, all three friends believe Job's suffering is a punishment for some sin he has committed; all three tell him he must repent. But as readers, we know that Job is innocent of any wrongdoing.

I invite you to use Blake's "Job Rebuked by His Friends" as a jumping-off point to consider Job's story this week, perhaps during a time set aside for contemplation.

On Sunday we will also ordain and install officers to a new term of service. We will ordain Renee Soderlund to the office of Deacon and will install Renee, Rosie Lopez, Juli Salman, Bonnie Trujillo and Mary Schipper to the Deacon Class of 2022. We will install to the Ruling Elder Class of 2022 Siobhan Croto, Carol Litherland, Joyce Litherland, and Tom Trigg. This is always a special time in the life of the church family as we move into a new term and the promise of new possibilities. I am thankful for our new and returning officers and look forward to working with them. I know they will serve our church family faithfully.

JOB 3:1-4, 10: After [Job's friends sat in silence with him for seven days and nights] Job opened his mouth and cursed the day of his birth. <sup>2</sup>Job said:

<sup>3</sup> 'Let the day perish on which I was born, and the night that said, "A man-child is conceived."

<sup>4</sup> Let that day be darkness! May God above not seek it, or light shine on it...

<sup>10</sup> because it did not shut the doors of my mother's womb, and hide trouble from my eyes.

JOB 4:1-9: Then Eliphaz the Temanite answered:

<sup>2</sup> 'If one ventures a word with you, will you be offended? But who can keep from speaking?

<sup>3</sup> See, you have instructed many; you have strengthened the weak hands.

<sup>4</sup> Your words have supported those who were stumbling, and you have made firm the feeble knees.

<sup>5</sup> But now it has come to you, and you are impatient; it touches you, and you are dismayed.

<sup>6</sup> Is not your fear of God your confidence, and the integrity of your ways your hope?

<sup>7</sup> 'Think now, who that was innocent ever perished? Or where were the upright cut off?

<sup>8</sup> As I have seen, those who plough iniquity and sow trouble reap the same.

<sup>9</sup> By the breath of God they perish, and by the blast of his anger they are consumed.

JOB 7:11-21: 'Therefore I will not restrain my mouth;

I will speak in the anguish of my spirit; I will complain in the bitterness of my soul.

<sup>12</sup> Am I the Sea, or the Dragon, that you set a guard over me?

<sup>13</sup> When I say, "My bed will comfort me, my couch will ease my complaint,"

<sup>14</sup> then you scare me with dreams and terrify me with visions,

<sup>15</sup> so that I would choose strangling and death rather than this body.

<sup>16</sup> I loathe my life; I would not live forever. Let me alone, for my days are a breath.

<sup>17</sup> What are human beings, that you make so much of them, that you set your mind on them,

<sup>18</sup> visit them every morning, test them every moment?

<sup>19</sup> Will you not look away from me for a while, let me alone until I swallow my spittle?

<sup>20</sup> If I sin, what do I do to you, you watcher of humanity? Why have you made me your target?

Why have I become a burden to you? <sup>21</sup> Why do you not pardon my transgression and take away my iniquity?

For now I shall lie in the earth; you will seek me, but I shall not be.'
