Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

Last Sunday, we spent some time with 6^{th} century BCE prophet Ezekiel, to whom God said that the shepherds the leaders—of Israel had failed to care for their people. Through Ezekiel, we learned about the value God places on justice and the demands for leading with justice put on those who are shepherds to God's people.

This week, we go back in time to hear from the 8th century BCE prophet Isaiah. If you're familiar with the Book of Isaiah, you know that it is lengthy—66 chapters—and spans a broad historical path of a couple hundred years. The first part of Isaiah, from which our text for Sunday comes, was written by the prophet Isaiah who lived and prophesied in the 8th century BCE. Other arts of the 66 chapters were written by others in different times; scholars speak of First, Second, and Third Isaiah.

Sunday, we will read from the first part of chapter six, often referred to as Isaiah's call. In this reading, we will hear that a seraph—a six-winged angel—purifies Isaiah by touching a live coal to his lips. Here are two paintings of this scene—the first (right), "Prophet Isaiah" by 18th century Italian artist Antonio Belestra; the second (below), "The Prophet Isaiah," created in 1968 by Marc Chagall. I encourage you to spend some time taking in the details of these paintings. What do you notice?
