

Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

It's a beautiful fall day as I write to you; from my front window I can see the turning leaves on our neighbor's tree blowing in the breeze. I am looking forward to a few days in the Colorado autumn sun during my Study Leave next week at Sacred Heart Jesuit Retreat House. The forecast calls for 60's and mostly sunny, so I'll be enjoying the sidewalks and trails that wind through the property of this beautiful place during my days of silent retreat. I'll share photos when I return! Thanks to Pat Halverson, who will be filling the pulpit this Sunday.

I want to share with you that the Re-Entry Task Force continues to move forward with plans for our worship service to become a hybrid service once it is safe to do so. Session has approved an expenditure of funds to equip the sanctuary and Perea Hall so that we can have worshippers in both spaces if the numbers require it, as well as have folks who are attending the service virtually with us. Please know that purchasing, installing, and training operators for this equipment will take some time. As the Task Force continues to research the safest possible way for us to gather, we believe that having folks attend a full Sunday morning worship service in the church building will not be wise for some time to come. It is simply not safe to be together in an enclosed space—especially once the weather necessitates that the heating be on—for that full time. We will continue to worship via Zoom for now.

However, we know that some of you are feeling a deep need to be in the sanctuary and we also know that the research indicates it is much safer to gather together—following COVID restrictions—for brief periods of time. To that end, Session has approved a brief, monthly Word and Prayer service tentatively scheduled for 4 p.m. on the afternoons of October 25, November 22, and December 20. We will strictly follow these guidelines: Worshippers must wear masks. They will enter through the main sanctuary doors, where they will sign in and use hand sanitizer. They will be directed to a seat. Following this 15-minute service, worshippers will leave through the west door. We can accommodate about 20 individuals or couples (who live together) and still maintain required distancing. Reservations will be required. If you would like to attend the October 25 service, please email or call the church office to reserve a space. Please be aware that the governor may tighten restrictions should the state's cases of COVID-19 require it; if updated restrictions so require, we'll cancel the service.

Please remember that, whether we worship from our kitchen tables, our patios, our living rooms, or our sanctuary, we are in the presence of God, who is at home with us wherever we may be.
