Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

When we gather via Zoom for the Lord's Day this Sunday, we will share communion together. Please have a bite of something simple to eat and a sip of something to drink ready. Remember: when Jesus sat at that table with his disciples, he took the elements most common to their kitchens—bread and wine—to share as he asked them to remember him. So our elements, too, can be the simple staples of our cupboards and refrigerators—a cracker or piece of fruit, a sip of juice or coffee. We can trust that Christ will be spiritually present in them.

This Sunday we will be hearing from the prophet Amos who, like Isaiah, Micah, and Hosea, prophesied in the 8<sup>th</sup> century B.C.E. Amos was from the Southern Kingdom of Judah but was called to prophesy in the Northern Kingdom of Israel, especially in the cities of Bethel and Samaria. Amos decried the disparity of wealth between



the rich and the poor. As we will hear on Sunday, he called out unjust and unequal treatment of people by the courts of the time. And he reminds us that God hates it when we pretend to be pious in worship but fail to act with love toward each other as soon as we walk away from our religious observances.

This 1954 painting, called "Amos the Spokesman of God," is by artist Frank O. Salisbury. What do you think the artist is saying about Amos?

We will also have a treat this Sunday as the response to the Word will be a virtual choir video of the lovely song "For Everyone Born." I'm grateful to Christine Gaudreau, Director of Music and Worship Arts at Wellshire Presbyterian Church in Denver, for permission to use this video. If you look closely, you might see our daughter Tegan among the singers. This song's lyrics are beautiful and so appropriate as we talk about issues of justice and God's steadfast love for us. I encourage you to spend some time with these words, which you'll find below.

V. 1: For everyone born, a place at the table, for everyone born, clean water and bread, a shelter, a space, a safe place for growing, for everyone born, a star overhead,


Refrain: and God will delight when we are creators of justice and joy, compassion and peace; yes, God will delight when we are creators of justice, justice and joy!
