Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

This Sunday we are invited to remember the national church's Peace and Global Witness Offering, which "encourages the church to cast off anxiety and fear, discord and division, and embrace our God's mission of reconciliation to those around the corner and around the world" [PCUSA) website]. What better way to honor that encouragement than to acknowledge our community's Hunger Awareness Month and to listen to the prophet Micah's caution against false prophets?

Like Isaiah, Micah was an 8th century B.C.E. prophet. From the town of Moresheth in Judah, Micah is sometimes called a prophet of the marketplace (as opposed to a prophet of the temple). He was particularly concerned with how political policies affected the peasant class. I have been trying to "read" the faces of the people as I look at this drawing by 19th century artist Gustav Doré called "Micah Exhorts the Israelites to

Repent." Their expressions are interesting; are they ashamed? Apathetic? Defiant?

Micah predicted an Assyrian invasion unless his words were heeded. As we've been learning, those words, like the words of many other prophets, called leaders to focus on justice and the good of all the people rather than on self-interest. Indeed, Assyria did attack and much of Judah was dominated by the Assyrians.

I'm often reminded, when I read the prophets, the words of Martin Luther King: "Without justice, there can be no peace."

Our awareness of those who go hungry and our work to ensure that the inexcusable issue of hunger is addressed is one way in which we can

seek justice. I'm glad that Mayor Trujillo has designated October "Hunger Awareness Month," but hope that we will remain aware of the needs of the hungry every month until no one knows hunger in a world of abundance.

Hunger and Poverty Snapshot*

- One in 9 households struggles to put food on the table. (USDA, ERS, Household Food Security in the United States in 2018)
- 43,138,824 people live in counties with poverty rates of 20 percent or more. (U.S. Census Bureau, 2012-2016 American Community 5-Year data. Table S1701.)
- People of color in the United States are 2 times more likely than whites to live with hunger and poverty. (Bread estimations based on data from 2013-2017 American Community Survey 5 Year data. Tables B17001B, B17001C, and B17001E, B17001H, B17001I.)
- An individual must earn \$16.07 per hour in New Mexico to provide for a family, yet, the state minimum wage is \$7.50. (Dr. Amy K. Glasmeier and MIT, Living Wage Calculator. Hourly living wage based on standard four-person household with two adults and two children. Living wages for single parent households are much higher. Published January 2019.). NOTE: AS OF JANUARY 1, 2020, NEW MEXICO'S MINIMUM WAGE IS \$9/HOUR.
