Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

As we enter the fourth and last week of Advent, we will light the candle of Love. Our Scripture will welcome us into the story of a young woman who receives a visit from an angel, who finds herself pregnant and unwed, and who identifies herself as God's servant as she prepares to birth the Christ child.

We will celebrate the Lord's Supper as our Advent waiting draws near fruition. Please have a bite of something to eat and a sip of something to drink with you as you zoom in for worship. Just as Jesus used the ordinary foodstuff common to first century homes—bread and wine—use what is common in your home. The presence of Christ will be in it as we share the sacred feast!

Below, you'll find some suggestions for your Advent devotionals for the week of love.

Sunday – We light the candle of Love this week. Pray this or a similar prayer each day as you light a candle: We praise you, O God of Love, for showing your love to us through the birth of Jesus, the Christ. Give us pause to drink in that love during these last few days of Advent waiting. Let your love guide us in all we do. Amen. This week, start each day's devotional with this prayer.

Monday – Write or draw how you experience love. You may choose to write a poem or prayer, a short story, or a journal entry. You may draw a simple image in pencil. Or paint an entire canvas in oils. Feel free to revise/continue this work throughout the week.

Tuesday – Ponder this acrostic poem, "Carols," by Sharon Vander Meer:

Call out! Shout for joy!
Advent sings of a baby boy,
Reigning not as a regal king.
One babe in the manger, that's the thing.
Live, love, laugh, dance, sing and shout!
Sharing this, His love, is what Christmas is about.

Wednesday – Take an action to show God's love in a big way today by gifting those whom we have pledged to remember as a Matthew 25 church: the hungry and thirsty, the imprisoned, the sick, the naked, the stranger. Write a letter to a prisoner, go the extra step with a food or monetary donation to a local soup kitchen or food distribution center, donate to an organization that works toward a cure for a particular disease.

Thursday – Do something extra special for someone you love. And then attend the Christmas Eve Service of Lessons and Carols and absorb the magnitude of God's love for us through the Christmas story.

Friday – Take a Christmas Day walk—around your house, yard, neighborhood or wherever you'd like. As you walk, look for something that demonstrates love in some way. Take a photo of it. (If you don't have a camera with you, take a mental photo.) Share the photo on the church Facebook page or with a friend.

Saturday – Look back over the devotional activities for the week—the prayer, what you've written or drawn, Sharon's poem, your action of love, your Christmas Eve "extra special" something or attendance at worship, and your photo. Articulate for yourself what these things reveal about how you see love in your life and in the world. How might our Potter God be shaping you through love?

And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you.' But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.' Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'
