D.R. and I will be enjoying some vacation time starting Christmas Day. Thank you to those who have stepped in to lead worship while I am away. This Sunday, December 27, Renee Soderlund will keep things organized and on track as worship leader. Thank you to Carol Linder who will be Zoom host while D.R. and I are away and, of course, to Karyl Lyne, Em Krall, and our singers. Thanks also to Linda Solyntjes, who works with me and, for these couple of weeks, with our guest preachers to get bulletins out to everyone. On January 3, we'll welcome our own Pastor Emeritus Rev. Randy Campbell to the pulpit and Elder of the Month Carol Litherland as Worship Leader. This Sunday, I am pleased that my good friend, The Rev. ³³And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. ³⁴Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

³⁶There was also a prophet, Anna, daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, ³⁷then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.
