Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

This week as we walk "On the Way with Jesus," we see Jesus come up against church leaders who are enraged that he fails to follow the letter of the law when it comes to Sabbath practices. In one story, Jesus' hungry disciples pluck and eat grain from a field on the Sabbath. In another, Jesus heals a man, restoring his hand to wholeness, on the Sabbath day. We'll explore a bit about the message Jesus' actions were meant to convey to the people of his time and how we might consider that message in our own time.

I ask that you spend some time before Sunday thinking about what you learned about Sabbath practice when you were growing up and what it means to you now. How and when do you seek Sabbath in your life? Have your Sabbath practices changed during this time of COVID? As we begin to look toward a time when we will be able to resume activities we consider more "normal," what Sabbath practices might you keep from this time? To what will you return that you've been unable to do under COVID restrictions?

As is our tradition on 5th Sundays of the month, we will respond to God's word for us with a healing ritual for ourselves, for our country, and for our world. (In other words, we will do some healing of our own on this Sabbath day!) If you would like to participate in the anointing part of this healing service, please have with you a small bit of oil, lotion, perfume, or even water with which to anoint your forehead at the appropriate time.

Additionally, we will bless several prayer shawls, made to comfort those who are facing illness or grief. While we can't lay hands on the shawls as we bless them, some of our deacons will hold them as we pray that the shawls bless those who receive them.

Finally, a word about Ash Wednesday (read more in the newsletter, which will be coming out soon). On Ash Wednesday, we move into a time of reflection and repentance, a time when we harken to the creation story, remembering that we were created from the dust of the earth and to the earth we will return. Rather than marking ourselves with ashes, we ask you to retrieve a bit of dirt from your yard and make some mud (remember making mud pies when you were a kid?) with which to mark yourself during our Ash Wednesday liturgy.

SCRIPTURE Luke 6:1-11

One sabbath while Jesus was going through the cornfields, his disciples plucked some heads of grain, rubbed them in their hands, and ate them. But some of the Pharisees said, 'Why are you doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?' Jesus answered, 'Have you not read what David did when he and his companions were hungry? He entered the house of God and took and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and gave some to his companions?' Then he said to them, 'The Son of Man is lord of the sabbath.'

On another sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught, and there was a man there whose right hand was withered. The scribes and the Pharisees watched him to see whether he would cure on the sabbath, so that they might find an accusation against him. Even though he knew what they were thinking, he said to the man who had the withered hand, 'Come and stand here.' He got up and stood there.
