Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

I will be taking this Sunday off for a bit of down time before we move into the Lenten season. I know you will welcome Rev. James Brown to the pulpit. I have recently gotten to know Jim a bit through our work in the presbytery and am pleased that he will be preaching this week.

Jim is a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary and served as pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Santa Fe from 1976-1987, during which time he was the president of the Ghost Ranch Foundation for several years. He subsequently was pastor of St. Peter's Presbyterian Church in Rancho Palos Verdes, CA and Market Square Presbyterian Church in Harrisburg, PA, with a term as Executive Director of the General Assembly Council in between. Jim served on the Committee of 21 that drafted "A Brief Statement of Faith," which is part of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Book of Confessions. Jim and his wife Nina retired to Santa Fe in 2012, and in recent years he has been a member of the Commission on Ministry of the Presbytery of Santa Fe.

This week in our liturgical calendar, we hear the story of Jesus' transfiguration from the gospel of Luke. Jim will speak on "Transfiguration During a Pandemic." That certainly sounds like a message worth hearing as we continue under COVID restrictions even as we begin the process of vaccinations throughout the country.

I ran across a sonnet about the transfiguration by poet and Anglican priest Malcolm Guite, which I share below. I hope you will find it thought-provoking.
