Somehow, we are already coming up on the last weekend of May. This Sunday is the fifth Sunday of the month, so we will have our traditional 5th Sunday healing service. Please have a bit of oil or water with you when you Zoom in if you would like to participate in the anointing of this healing service. Our worship time will center on God's sustaining love through our season of pandemic as we all worship via Zoom before moving to hybrid worship on June 6.

This Sunday will also be our last "Zoom only" worship service. On June 6 we will move to a hybrid service, meaning that some of our church family will worship in person in the sanctuary and others will Zoom in. Because we are still uncertain about when the equipment can be installed to stream the service to Perea Hall, we are asking that you call or email the church office BY NOON ON THURSDAY, JUNE 3, if you would like to worship in the sanctuary on June 6. While capacity requirements for churches have been lifted, distancing recommendations have not been, so we will only be able to accommodate about 25 people in the sanctuary. There will be more information about this hybrid service in next week's bulletin and in the June newsletter.
