Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

This Sunday we complete our series on "The Church at Work." Over the course of the last few weeks, we've been reminded about the church's work to adapt to change—as we moved to Zoom worship some 15 months ago and as we have moved into hybrid worship. And we've been reminded about our work to celebrate and support all of God's people as we have talked about the wonder of diversity among our human family and the very real need to continue our work toward equality and justice. On Sunday, we will ponder how we work to follow the Spirit's call in our lives and explore the difficulty we sometimes have in talking about our spiritual questions. I hope you will join us, on Zoom or on site, for worship this week. Please note that we won't be taking reservations this week, as we have had plenty of room the last few weeks to accommodate those who've wanted to be in the sanctuary.

Please note that I will be on study leave this coming week (June 28-July 4). I will be focusing on worship planning for the next several months. I always love taking time to delve into lectionary Scripture readings and to discern what they might want us to hear from them. Please pray that God's Spirit will give me insight during this time. Finally, friends, I want to acknowledge that we are once again a church family in grief. Please hold Gail in your prayers as well as Bernie's children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren as they grieve Bernie's death. And, of course, reach out to one another with your memories of Bernie. It is always especially hard for a church family to suffer losses close together, as we have with Joyce's death last month and Bernie's earlier this week. Perhaps the poem below, "In Lieu of Flowers" by Shawna Lemay, will be helpful to you at this time. I think that both Bernie and Joyce would have liked it.

A few years ago I read a friend's father's obituary on Facebook. His father had requested in lieu of flowers, please take a friend or loved one out for lunch.

Although I love flowers very much, I won't see them when I'm gone. So in lieu of flowers: Buy a book of poetry written by someone still alive, sit outside with a cup of tea, a glass of wine, and read it out loud, by yourself or to someone, or silently.

Spend some time with a single flower. A rose maybe. Smell it, touch the petals. Really look at it.

Drink a nice bottle of wine with someone you love.

Or, Champagne. And think of what John Maynard Keynes said, "My only regret in life is that I did not drink more Champagne." Or what Dom Perignon said when he first tasted the stuff: "Come quickly! I am tasting stars!" Take out a paint set and lay down some colours.

Watch birds. Common sparrows are fine. Pigeons, too. Geese are nice. Robins. In lieu of flowers, walk in the trees and watch the light fall into it. Eat an apple, a really nice big one. I hope it's crisp.

Have a long soak in the bathtub with candles, maybe some rose petals. Sit on the front stoop and watch the clouds. Have a dish of strawberry ice cream in my name. If it's winter, have a cup of hot chocolate outside for me. If it's summer, a big glass of ice water. If it's autumn, collect some leaves and press them in a book you love. I'd like that. Sit and look out a window and write down what you see. Write some other things down. In lieu of flowers.

I would wish for you to flower.

I would wish for you to blossom, to open, to be beautiful.
