Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

I did a bit of a doubletake when I put the date on the bulletin for this Sunday. November 14! Not only did it somehow get to be mid-November, but the date clicked in my head as my niece Karen's birthday. November is a big birthday month in the family. Karen and her older sister Teresa both have November birthdays (they are 11 ½ months apart in age). Teresa's birthday is the day before mine, making her one day short of being exactly four years younger than I. These nieces' mother also had a November birthday. And two of our grandchildren have birthdays this month, too; Diamond turns 8 and Will turns 6. It's curious how family birthdays sometimes cluster like that. In fact, these birthdays not only all happen in November, but three of them clump together—Teresa's, mine, and Will's on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, and 28<sup>th</sup>—dates that almost always fall on Thanksgiving weekend. When I was a kid, I used to be a bit disappointed that I had to share a birthday with a major holiday weekend; it sometimes felt like MY day got a little lost in the holiday celebration. Now, I rather like sharing all these birthdays during a month when we focus on gratitude. It's a strong reminder that we have so much for which to be thankful—family, relationships, our very lives. Whether or not your family has a cluster of birthdays this month, I wish you moments set aside to be grateful.

Before COVID, our family had started a tradition of meeting in Kansas City for the holiday. Emily and Pat would pack up the kids and drive there from Milwaukee; Tegan and Rosalie would drive in from Denver; and we would drive up from Vegas. Of course, that couldn't happen last year and won't happen this year because COVID has rearranged our lives. But Emily, Tegan, D.R. and I will be in Kansas City very briefly this month to attend the memorial service for D.R.'s nephew Jared. As is often true for memorial services, this service will offer bittersweet time to gather with family while we give thanks for Jared's too-short life and say our goodbyes. Please hold the Palmer family in prayer, especially Jared's two young children.

Worship this Sunday will give us yet another reason to be thankful as we recognize even more of the gifts God gives us. Over the last few weeks, we have looked at the gifts of bread (including the unique economy God suggests for us, which emphasizes sharing rather than hoarding), full hearts capable of carrying our character and repenting when we need to, holy bodies that are temples for the living Christ, and this week, living water that can help us quench our thirst for justice and righteousness. I look forward to seeing you on Sunday.
