Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

This coming Sunday will be a paradox of sorts. Sunday morning, the third Sunday of Advent, is the Sunday of JOY. Our Scripture takes us once again to the exile, this time as told by the prophet scholars refer to as Second Isaiah. (Scholars divide the book of Isaiah into First, Second, and Third Isaiah, believing that it was written across time but compiled into a single book.) This anonymous prophet wrote during the time of the exile, and Sunday we will look at verses from the last chapter of Second Isaiah, as the exile nears its end and the people hear about God's promised restoration in terms of great joy and abundance.

Then, on Sunday evening at 5:00 p.m., we will hold a Blue Christmas service, which will allow those of us who find it difficult to be joyful during this season because of loss, pain, burdens and fears to acknowledge those feelings. And although acknowledging these feelings seems quite paradoxical from the joy found in the third Sunday of Advent, that acknowledgement—and the assurance that God is with us whether we dance with joy or sit in lament—is necessary for joy to creep back into our hearts. Please join us for this Blue Christmas worship if you carry something heavy and need some space to be with others who are feeling heaviness, too. You can join us in the sanctuary or on Zoom; bulletins will be posted online and hard copies will be available in the sanctuary.

As I look forward to Christmas, I hope you will join us for our traditional *Lessons and Responses* Christmas Eve worship (at 5:30 p.m.) and a non-traditional worship on Sunday, December 26, which will be full of the joy of the season with story and song.
