Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

We gather this coming Sunday for the fourth Sunday of Advent—less than a week before Christmas Day! It's a little hard to believe, here in northern New Mexico, that Christmas is so close, given temperatures in the 60s as I write this. I'm longing to wear turtlenecks and sweaters, especially the Christmas-y ones with snowmen on them. But somehow it seems wrong to expose those fabric snowmen to the warm winds of December 2021! But I'll be doing just that because I have to uphold my final-Sunday-of-Advent-Christmas-jumper tradition this weekend!

As we come together this week, we move from a series of Hebrew Bible readings that began our Narrative Lectionary year in September into the Gospel of John. Sunday we will look at part of the Johannine Prologue—the first 18 verses of this gospel. Over the next few months, we will explore Jesus' life as depicted in John's gospel. It is a fascinating book, much different from the other gospels, as you have probably noticed. Indeed, scholar Bart Ehrman notes:

Nowhere in the other Gospels is Jesus said to be the Word of God, the creator of the universe, the equal of God, or the one sent from heaven and soon to return. Nowhere else does Jesus claim that to see him is to see the Father, that to hear him is to hear the Father, and that to reject him is to reject the Father.

Our focus on John in the coming weeks promises to stimulate our thinking about this person whose birth in Bethlehem we'll be celebrating shortly.

I know that many of you will be traveling over Christmas week but plan to be with us on Zoom for Christmas Eve worship. I hope that those of you who are not traveling will join us in the sanctuary or on Zoom to celebrate Jesus' birth-the incarnation of God's love, grace, and truth.

PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

SCRIPTURE READING John 1:1-13

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me." ') From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.
