Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

Sunday is May 1<sup>st</sup>—May Day. When I was a child, I loved May Day, when we would pick spring flowers from the yard and leave them in old jars or cans filled with water on neighbors' doorsteps. You could say that those were tracks I made as a young person--perhaps tracks that some elderly neighbors appreciated; certainly tracks that left fond memories of good feelings received from giving without expectation of return.

As we enter May, we enter into a time of congregational renewal, which begins formally on May 14 with our first renewal event, funded by the generous Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal grant. This event, a workshop in two parts by John Stokes, founder of The Tracking Project, will help us learn about and experience outdoor tracking and how it can be a spiritual discipline as we enter into our time of "Tracking the Word: Embodying the Spirit." Part I of the workshop will allow John to teach us about tracking in an outdoor setting (exact location/time to be announced soon); Part II will take place in the church, where John will help us see connections between tracking and spirituality. We hope to see you on the trail, but if you are unable to do the outdoor portion of the event, please join us for the indoor portion of the event.

As for this Sunday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, we will be starting to think in terms of tracking, talking specifically about some of the tracks that FUPC has left in this community and beyond during its 150 years. Why do those tracks matter? What legacy have they left? I'd like to encourage you all to think about your earliest memories as part of this church. For some of you, those memories will be decades old; for others, only a few years. What was the "track" that led you here?

We will also have communion on Sunday, so if you will be joining us via Zoom, please plan to have something to eat and drink with you, knowing that Christ's table is not confined to the sanctuary, but reaches all who seek God.

It is the table at which we arrive when we seek to follow Jesus; it is the table at which we are invited to come and see God's steadfast love for all people. At this table, we find what we are looking for and we are filled!

The Lord be with you! All: And also with you!

Lift up your hearts. All: We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give our thanks to the God of all creation! Gracious God, we thank you for being a God who tracks your people in order to show them your love and your path to abundant life.

You provide the beauty of creation and within it, the things we need for our bodies and our souls. You have always shown your people the way by sending prophets, teachers, and communities in which to share life.

And those same tracks lead us to an empty tomb.

They lead us to proclaim that Christ is risen! They lead us to know the hope of new life for all of us!

We give thanks that, in your love for us, you trust us to lead others to you.

We know that others will follow the tracks we leave as we follow Christ. We know those tracks lead to the abundant life we celebrate at this table today, where our spirits are filled and nourished.

Gracious God, pour out your Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this juice, that they may become for us the communion of the body and blood of Christ. Through Christ and in the unity of the Spirit, we pray as we offer our thanks to you, almighty God. **Amen.**

# Congregational Renewal Event with Tracker John Stokes on Saturday, May 14

Our Congregational Renewal is about to begin! Your task force on the renewal activities and planning for guest preachers, workshops, potlucks, and fellowship opportunities has been meeting for many months to bring this time of renewal to life. The activities planned over the 17-week period of the renewal time for our congregation, while Pastor Katie is on sabbatical having her own time of renewal, will offer many opportunities to experience new things, try different activities, worship in non-traditional ways, and participate with some dynamic guests to our pulpit.

The first of these guests is John Stokes, who will be here on May 14 and May 15. John Stokes, Director of The Tracking Project in Corrales, NM, will lead us in a two-part workshop focusing on how we can learn to track ourselves and our spirituality, as individuals and as a church community. Tracking anything involves keen and thoughtful observation – observation that is a catalyst for the tracker to be able to envision what has taken place and make a reasonable prediction about what will take place next.

On Saturday afternoon, May 14, there will be two opportunities to look at the skills of Tracking and Nature Awareness as they apply to the tracks on the ground in Nature — techniques of quieting the Mind, slow movement and using the light. The first workshop (1:00-3:00) will take place outdoors and the second workshop (3:30-5:30) will be in Perea Hall at FUPC. Please plan to join us for both!

Then on Sunday morning, May 15, John will give a sermon on **Paying Attention to our Tracks** — **What Path Have I Been Following?** His sermon will address how we can apply these awareness skills to look at the quality of attention we bring to our life. He will open with Ohe´n:ton Karihwatéhkwen, the Opening Words from the Iroquois Confederacy.

John Stokes, founder & Director of The Tracking Project, Inc. in Corrales, New Mexico, is a well-known musician, performer, writer and teacher of tracking. Since 1980 he has worked and traveled extensively in his efforts to bring awareness of the natural world and the integrity of indigenous peoples to interested people around the world.

The worship service will be followed by our first potluck in over two years! Be thinking about what favorite dish you would like to bring to the potluck to share with our congregation. Community Life will provide the beverages.
