Dear FUPC Family and Friends,

Greetings! As I write this at 10:30 a.m. it's already 83 degrees outside, heading for a high of 91. I find myself questioning "the good old summertime" and wondering why the heat does not feel as insignificant as it did when I was a kid spending long summer days outside without a second thought. Part of the answer is, of course, that I'm not a kid anymore. But part of the answer is climate change. When we had our first house built in Colorado about 40 years ago, builders were not installing central air. That would be unthinkable now. Gone are the predictable summer afternoon showers in that part of the country. Gone are the labels "unusual" and "rare" for days when the temps climb into the 90s or higher. I have only been in New Mexico for a little over six years, but I get the feeling that what used to be unusual here is, perhaps, not so unusual any more. Our earth is suffering.

After celebrating all of creation last Sunday, this Sunday we will pay particular attention to the earth—noting her beauty, lamenting her pain, and looking at ways in which she might be healed. I leave you with a poem called "Letter to Someone Living Fifty Years from Now" by Matthew Olzmann and ask you to ponder what environmental legacy we as a faith community want to work for.

You probably doubt that we were capable of joy, but I assure you we were.

We still had the night sky back then, and like our ancestors, we admired its illuminated doodles of scorpion outlines and upside-down ladles.

Absolutely, there were some forests left! Absolutely, we still had some lakes!

I'm saying, it wasn't all lead paint and sulfur dioxide. There were bees back then, and they pollinated a euphoria of flowers so we might contemplate the great mysteries and finally ask, "Hey guys, what's transcendence?"

And then all the bees were dead.
